There will be 750 runners of all ages. The home base for the marathon will be the Cotter School Cafeteria. A pasta supper will be served on the night prior to the marathon. Everyone is invited and the charge is 10.00 per person.

The Chamber is requested to set up and man two water stations along the marathon route. We would be serving snacks and drinks to the runners. We are also asked to provide watcher golf carts to patrol the route.

Mr. Gigliotto explained all proceeds will go to World Vision to aide third world countries. Last year they raised 21,000.00.

Awards for the runners will be given out at the school cafeteria. During the event there will be a tennis shoe drive.
